Federal Law Requires Face Masks on Muni

To help stop the spread of COVID-19, [federal law requires wearing a mask](#) in Muni stations and while riding transit. Violations can result in denial of boarding or removal from Muni and may carry federal penalties. Face coverings like scarves and bandanas do not meet this requirement. Under guidelines issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, taxi drivers are required to wear a face covering while transporting passengers. Supplemental Muni Service

Muni will operate supplemental **78X Arena Express** service:

- **Pre-event express shuttle service** from 16th Street BART Station to 16th and 3rd streets will start two and a half hours before each game/event and will end one hour after game/event starts.
- **Post-event express shuttle service** from 16th and 3rd streets to 16th Street BART Station will run until the area clears.

Special Event Parking Rates

During basketball games and other major events with more than 10,000 expected attendees at the arena, **parking meters close to the arena will charge a special event rate of \$8 per hour**. These rates help reduce congestion and keep parking spots available in the neighborhoods near the arena, discouraging circling for free or cheap parking. Start times for special event rates vary based on the start time of the event. More information on special event parking regulations can be found on www.sfmta.com/special-event-parking.

Street Closures

To accommodate events that will take place at the arena, the following street closures will be enforced two hours before and one hour after each event:

- 16th Street between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Warriors Way between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Northbound 3rd Street between 16th Street and Warriors Way will also be closed approximately 30 minutes before and 45 minutes after an event.
- Only local access will be allowed on Northbound Illinois Street between Mariposa and 16th streets.

No Parking Zone

To facilitate loading and pick up for Muni customers and patrons, **NO PARKING** will be in effect at these locations during events:

- 16th Street between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Warriors Way between 3rd Street and Terry Francois Boulevard
- Terry Francois Boulevard (TFB) between Warriors Way and the 700 Block of TFB

Taxi Stands

- There is one taxi stand located on southbound Terry Francois Boulevard.
- Ramp Taxis should use the loading zone on eastbound Warriors Way (formerly South Street) at Bridgeview Way.

Additional Passenger Loading

- There is passenger loading on 4th Street which may be accessed by walking west on Gene Friend Way pedestrian path.
- There is also passenger loading on Owens Street by continuing west on Gene Friend Way pedestrian path.

Friday, April 8 through next Wednesday, April 13: The San Francisco Giants will play six home games at the ballpark. Listed below are teams to play and start times for these games:

- **Three games against the Miami Marlins: 1)** 1:35 p.m., Friday, April 8; **2)** 1:05 p.m., Saturday, April 9; and **3)** 1:05 p.m., Sunday, April 10.
- **Three games against the San Diego Padres: 1)** 6:45 p.m., Monday, April 11; **2)** 6:45 p.m., Tuesday, April 12; and **3)** 12:45 p.m., Wednesday, April 13.

Street Closures

To accommodate events that will take place at the ballpark, the following street closures will be enforced:

- Two and a half hours before the opening pitch, the SFMTA will close eastbound King Street between 3rd and 2nd streets to vehicle traffic. King Street will reopen after first pitch until the seventh inning.
- From the seventh inning until post-game traffic dies down, the SFMTA will again close eastbound King Street between 3rd and 2nd streets to vehicle traffic in order to reduce congestion on city streets.
- Additionally, the northbound portion of the 4th Street Bridge (Peter R. Maloney Bridge) will be closed to all traffic except Muni, taxis and bicycles during the post-game period.

Taxi Stands

- 2nd Street, west side, between Brannan and King Streets
- 2nd Street, east side, between Townsend and King Streets
- 3rd Street, east side, north of King Street

Saturday, April 9 and Sunday, April 10: The 55th Annual Cherry Blossom Festival will be held for two consecutive weekends, April 9-10 and April 16-17. The festival will take place from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m., each day. For event details visit www.sfcherryblossom.org.

The following street closures will be required beginning 4 a.m., Saturday through 11 p.m., Sunday:

- Post Street between Laguna and Fillmore streets
- Webster Street between Geary Boulevard and Sutter Street
- Buchanan Street between Bush and Sutter streets
- Intersection: Webster Street at Post Street

There will be no impact on Muni service.

Special Event Parking will be available for each of the four weekend days for the festival: Saturday, April 9; Sunday, April 10; Saturday, April 16 and Sunday, April 17:

- **Japan Center Main Garage at 1650 Geary Boulevard** will open from 7 a.m. until midnight, regular hourly rate applies.
- **Fillmore Street Annex Garage at 1650 Fillmore Street** will open from 7 a.m. until midnight. A \$25 flat-rate event parking fee will be charged for valet-assisted parking between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m., **NO** in and out privileges will be allowed. Regular hourly rate will apply between 6 p.m. and midnight.

Cesar Chavez Parade and Festival

Saturday, April 9: The annual Cesar Chavez Parade will begin at 11 a.m. Participants will gather at 19th Street between Dolores and Guerrero streets at 10 a.m. The festival will be held on 24th Street between Folsom and Bryant streets from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. For details visit cesarchavezday.org.

The parade will proceed from Dolores and 19th streets, east on 19th Street, south on Mission Street, east on 24th Street to Folsom Street. The festival area will take place on 24th Street between Treat and Bryant streets. Streets will re-open as the parade passes.

The following closures will be required for the festival from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.:

- 24th Street between Folsom and Bryant streets
- Lucky Street between 24th and 25th streets
- Treat Street between 23rd and 25th streets
- Balmy Street between 24th and 25th streets
- Harrison Street between 23rd and 25th streets
- Alabama Street between 23rd and 25th streets
- Florida Street between 23rd and 25th streets
- Intersections closed at 23rd Street: Lucky, Treat, Balmy, Harrison, Alabama and Florida streets.

Local residential access will be allowed on Florida and Alabama streets.

The following Muni routes will be affected: **14 Mission; 14R Mission Rapid; 27 Bryant; 48 Quintara/24th Street; 49 Van Ness/Mission and 67 Bernal Heights.**

San Francisco Lowriders Council Tribute to Selena

On Saturday, April 9, after the Cesar Chavez Parade and Festival, the San Francisco Low Rider Council will pay tribute to Selena with a lowrider cruise along Mission Street and through the local area. Lowriders will gather at 4 p.m. on Mission Street between Cesar Chavez and 22nd Street. Some transit corridors may become blocked for temporary periods of time.

There is no planned street closure. Temporary transit detour and traffic congestion should be expected. Travelers to the area should allow extra travel time.

Nepal Day Parade

On Saturday, April 9, there will be a Nepal Day Parade on Market Street to celebrate the Nepali New Year. The parade will gather at Embarcadero Plaza at 10:30 a.m., depart Embarcadero Plaza at 11:30 a.m., arrive UN Plaza at around 12:30 p.m., and celebrate at UN Plaza until 2 p.m. Personnel from San Francisco Police Department will escort the parade along the westbound lanes of Market Street.

There is no planned street closure. Temporary transit detour and traffic congestion should be expected. Traffic along the parade route should expect minor delay. Travelers to the area should allow extra travel time.

Sunday Streets – Tenderloin

Sunday, April 10: Sunday Streets will take place in the Tenderloin neighborhoods. The event route travels along Larkin Street from Grove to O’Farrell streets, Ellis Street from Larkin to Taylor streets, and Golden Gate Avenue from Polk to Jones streets. The route will be available for recreational activities from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Sunday Streets is an open streets event put on as a joint project between the SFMTA and Livable City to promote active lifestyle and bicycle and pedestrian activities. Streets will be closed to traffic and turned over for bike and pedestrian activities for these events. The event is free to all participants. For event details visit www.sundaystreetsf/tenderloin.

The following street closures will be required from 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

- Ellis Street between Larkin and Taylor streets
- Golden Gate Avenue between Polk and Jones streets
- Larkin Street between Grove and O’Farrell Streets
- Intersections: Fulton Street, Golden Gate Avenue, Turk Street and Ellis Street at Larkin Street; Ellis Street and Golden Gate Avenue at Hyde Street

*Local access will be allowed along the route

Cross traffic will be allowed at the following locations:

- Eastbound on McAllister Street
- East and westbound on Eddy Street at Larkin and Leavenworth streets
- Northbound on Leavenworth Street

Traffic will be controlled by Parking Control officers and San Francisco police officers.

The **19 Polk** Muni route will be affected.

The Mobile Sales Van will also accept payment for or purchases of the following items:

- Parking/Transit Citation Payments (customers must present a ticket or letter listing the citation number)
- Monthly Lifeline stickers (for the month of March 2022)
- Pre-loaded Clipper Cards (\$11 value for \$10)
- Parking Meter Cards (\$25/\$50)
- \$5 Day Passes (valid on all Muni vehicles, except Cable Car)

Customers can pay with cash, credit/debit card or commuter check.

CONSTRUCTION WORK AND OTHER UPDATES

UPDATE: Park Presidio Lombard Temporary. HOV Lanes

Friday, April 1: Continued installation of the temporary HOV (High-Occupancy Vehicle) lanes on Park Presidio Boulevard and Park Presidio Bypass. Work will take approximately two to four more weekends and will take place on weekend nights from approximately 11 p.m. to 8 a.m. to minimize traffic impacts. UPDATE: L Taraval Improvement Project—Segment B

The SFMTA is leading a multi-agency collaboration with the San Francisco Public Works (SFPW) and the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) to replace and rehabilitate aging infrastructure along Taraval Street. The [L Taraval Improvement Project](#) will replace worn rails, overhead wires, water, and sewer lines and repave the entire street along the L Taraval Line, from West Portal to the SF Zoo to make pedestrian crossing safer, increase accessibility and improve transit reliability.

Segment B continues infrastructure work along the L Taraval line between Sunset Boulevard and 15th Avenue, and on Ulloa Street near West Portal.

Upgraded sewer and water lines, permanent boarding islands and increased accessibility are on the way!

Water and sewer work is currently underway. Construction is scheduled to take place from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

ONGOING: Castro Westbound Platform Elevator Closed for Upgrades

The rehabilitation on the westbound platform elevator at Muni Castro Station has begun and will continue for about six months. During this time, the elevator will be closed for upgrades.

The SFMTA is committed to continuously improving safety and reliability for all Muni customers even during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Castro elevator is the eighth of 12 being rehabilitated systemwide as part of the [Muni Elevator Improvement Project](#). The project will greatly improve accessibility and convenience, especially for wheelchair users, seniors, and others with disabilities who benefit from elevator access.

ONGOING: 19th Avenue (CA Route 1) Combined City Project

San Francisco Public Works is leading a multi-agency project to replace aging infrastructure and improve safety along 19th Avenue between Holloway Avenue and Lincoln Way.

Construction work for the first segment of this project along 19th Avenue between Lincoln Way and Noriega Street has begun.

As part of the [19th Avenue Combined City Project](#), the SFMTA will implement transit priority and safety improvements for people walking along the route of the 28 19th Avenue. The improvements will make it safer to walk, remove stops to make transit service more reliable, and enhance customers' experiences—on and off the bus.

ONGOING: 19th Avenue (CA Route 1) Combined City Project *continued*

To improve safety along 19th Avenue, the SFMTA will: **1)** install pedestrian bulbs at 19 intersections and transit bulbs at 13 intersections; **2)** modify traffic and pedestrian signals to give people who walk more time to cross the street; and **3)** extend the bus zone at one intersection. Installing transit bulbs allow Muni vehicles to stop for passengers without having to pull out of traffic, and pedestrian bulbs increase the visibility at intersections of people who walk.

As part of the project, seven Muni stops were removed on 19th Avenue between Irving Street and Ocean Avenue last October. **The following Muni routes have been affected with the stop removal:**

- **28 19th Avenue**
- **91 3rd Street/19th Avenue Owl**

ONGOING: Shared Spaces Program

The city's multi-agency [Shared Spaces](#) program opened some parts of streets in San Francisco to create public space for outdoor dining, retail, cultural activities and physical distancing. The program allows the use of sidewalks, parking space, full or partial streets, or other nearby public spaces like parks and plazas for a wide range of activities responding to the COVID pandemic, as allowed by San Francisco's Public Health Order. ONGOING: Essential Trip Card Discount Program

The SFMTA's temporary special program, [Essential Trip Card](#) (ETC) Program, will assist people with disabilities and older adults to make essential trips under Muni's temporary transit changes. The program provides two to three round trips at an 80% discount per month, i.e. rider pays \$6 to receive a value of \$30 or pays \$12 to receive a \$60 value. Riders may receive additional value up to \$120 of taxi service per month per customer upon request.

To qualify for the program: customer must be either age 65 or older or an adult with disabilities. Eligible adults may apply for the ETC program by calling 311 and mentioning the program. Staff will be available between 9 a.m. and 4:45 p.m., Monday through Friday.
