



Geary Projects Overview & Timeline

Preliminary Work: Coming late 2024 Major Construction: January 2025 – Fall 2027



What to Expect During Construction





- Work will be done in phases
- Construction activity will be intermittent
- Expect for crews to finish a portion of work on a block and then return later to work on a different aspect of work
- Excavated areas will be temporarily paved
- Final paving will occur as part of the separate Transit and Safety Surface Improvements contract

What to Expect During Construction

NO STOPPING LOCATION:
PERMIT INFORMATION:

Parking

- Temporarily prohibited in active construction zones
- Most restrictions during construction working hours only
- Some spaces will be used to stage materials and equipment

Traffic

- Vehicle and bus traffic will be maintained in both directions
- Two travel lanes will be open in both directions (in most cases)



What to Expect During Construction

Access

- Driveway access will be maintained, though there may be slight delays*
- Sidewalk access will be maintained, however modified walkways may sometimes be necessary

* Individual coordination will be done with businesses that require frequent access throughout the day.

Construction Impacts

 Noise, dust, and vibrations in active work zones


Quick-Build implementation update

• Bus shelters permitting process is complete! Shelters anticipated to be installed in November 2024.



Quick-Build implementation update

- The 14th Ave bike share station relocation onto the widened sidewalk is complete.
- The outbound 6th Ave bus stop is planned to be relocated to a new permanent farside bus bulb (coordinating with TNDC affordable housing) – tentative implementation date is now early 2025.
- A new lagging left-turn arrow at 11th Avenue is planned to be implemented in the fall (westbound Geary to southbound 11th Ave)



New widened sidewalk on 14th Ave south of Geary, after bike share station relocation

Business Support update

- Geary team continues to work with Small Business Working Group on:
 - Muni bus ad campaign advertising the Central Richmond. Ads are currently posted on buses throughout the city! (see following slides)
 - Decorative tree trunk wrapped lighting (in coordination with Greater Geary Merchants Association)

Community enhancement: Overview

- Project includes a community enhancement element to beautify the corridor
- Community prioritized **new trees** and **decorative sidewalks** at some bus stops in a survey conducted last spring
- Second round of outreach launched in late August focused on design details and is just concluding



Community enhancement: What we sought input on during 2nd round of outreach

- Tree placement
- Tree species
- Sidewalk design layout
- Nature-focused sidewalk design theme

All locations must meet accessibility and utility clearance requirements, and would try to minimize any visual impedance of storefront signage. Outreach will be done to adjacent properties.



Community enhancement: Decorative sidewalk layout options



 Blue areas indicate possible locations for decorative sidewalk treatment



Community enhancement: Decorative sidewalk design nature theme options

Possible Themes

- Sand dunes and ocean waves
- Golden Gate Park and greenery
- Golden Gate Bridge and fog
- □ Lands End and Seal Rock
- Native flora and fauna

One Theme vs. Two

- Outbound/inbound separate themes (e.g. outbound=ocean and inbound=nature)
- All bus stops have the same theme



Community enhancement: Interim survey results

Trees

- Most popular species:
 - Median: Coast Live Oak and Monterey Cypress
 - Sidewalk: California Buckeye and Primrose Tree
- Preferred placement: both sidewalks and median equally


Decorative Sidewalks

- Most popular layout: Banding along the boarding zone
- Most popular theme: Native flora and fauna
- IB/OB preference: Yes inbound greenery/park themed and outbound ocean themed



Community enhancement: Next steps


- **By end of year:** Finalize enhancement details and incorporate into project design package
- 2026-2027: Implementation during overall project construction




8. Geary Rapid Project update

Stanyan to Market Street

- The contractor has completed 3-years of plant establishment maintenance on the new street trees, which are now being transferred to SFPW Bureau of Urban Forestry (BUF).
- SFPW admin team is working on final contract payments and closeout. Once SFPW has completed their work, SFMTA Accounting can begin closeout.
